Finance Update By: Jenni Wysong



March offerings were \$21,682, 8% over last year, but we did have 5 Sundays in 2024 and only 4 in 2023. YTD offerings are still ahead of 2023 by 15% or \$10,457.

March expenses were \$14,705 (including \$2,351 of Conference Tithes and Apportionments) compared to \$22,749 in March of 2023. Pastor payroll and utilities were the accounts that provided the savings. YTD our expenses are down \$19,053 or 27%. When our new pastor begins in July, the full expense of his salary, pension, and insurance will kick back in.

We transferred \$20,000 from the proceeds of the youth house and property sale to the Parsonage Rehab Fund. The remaining \$107,940 is carved out in a Capital Fund (restricted to expenses of a capital nature) and is in an interest bearing Money Market fund at Lake City Bank.
